n=number of transactions

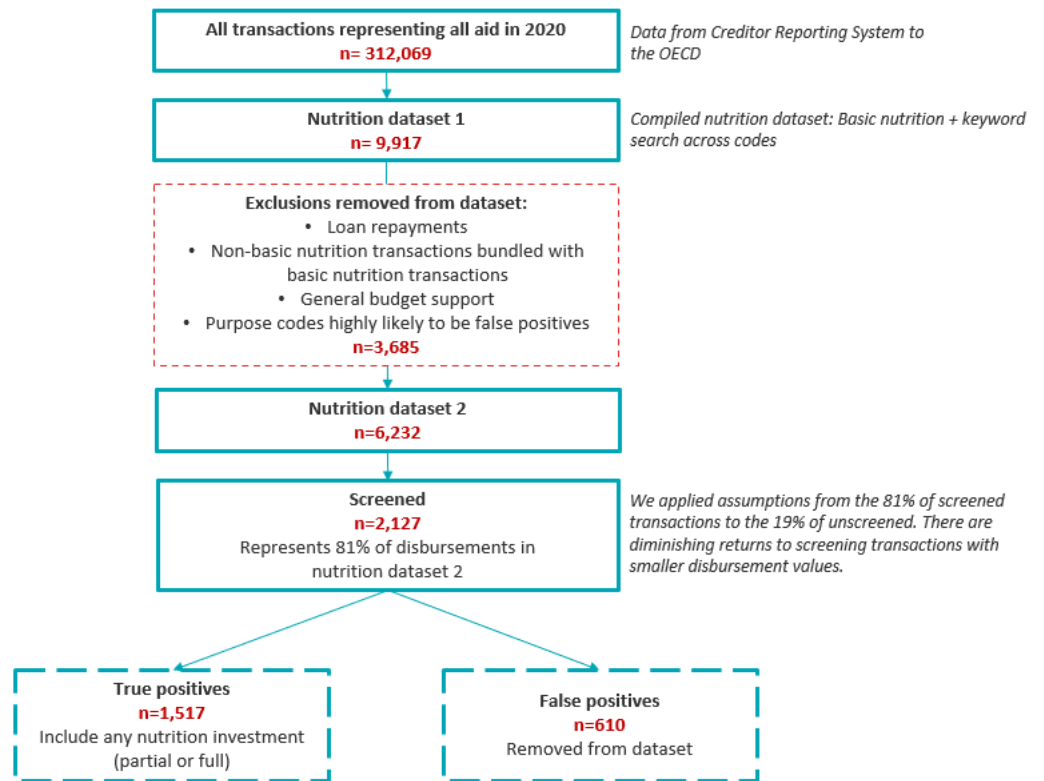
